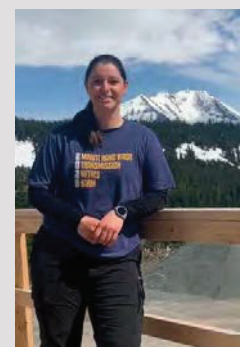
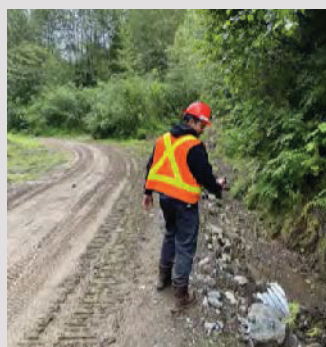
INDIGENOUS ENGAGEMENT

Skeena is committed to the principles of UNDRIP and developing meaningful relationships with Indigenous Communities. The project is located within the Tahltan Territory and asserted Traditional Territory of Tsetsaut Skii Km Lax Ha.

Concentrate transported to port of Stewart via Highway 37 and 37A will pass through Nass and Nass Wildlife Areas (as defined in the Nisga'a Final Agreement) of the Nisga'a Nation and the Territory of Gitanyow Nation.

TAHLTAN MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

Skeena launched a student mentorship program with Tahltan Nation in 2020 to provide university students and recent graduates in engineering and business an opportunity to work in planning, permitting, engineering and mine construction.



UNIQUE COLLABORATION AND DESIGN

Skeena is working closely with the Tahltan Heritage Resource Environmental Assessment Team (THREAT) to develop environmental and social design principles such that Skeena can act as good stewards on Tahltan land. These principles are used to inform and guide the Project design as it advances through its initial PEA design to its closure.
